

THE GARDENER'S DIARY With Martin Fish

Give houseplants a winter check-over to keep them healthy and growing. Check the compost and water as the compost starts to dry out. Wipe large leaves with a damp cloth to remove dust and mist foliage plants with water. On flowering plants, pick of faded blooms to encourage more buds.

On a dry day, when the surface of the lawn is dry, lightly rake the lawn to collect twigs and leaves that have accumulated and blown in over the past few weeks.

Wash greenhouses and cold frames to remove green slime and dirt that's built up on the glass over winter.

Start winter pruning on apple and pear trees by thinning over-crowded stems, cutting out dead wood and shorten long branches to maintain a good shape.

Give garden tools a thorough clean and oil to keep them in good condition ready for when you need them in spring.

Order seeds from mail order companies to make sure you get exactly the varieties you want before the spring rush.
