## THE GARDENER'S DIARY With Martin Fish

If you haven't already done it, now is the time to plant out tender plants in the garden, or in hanging baskets and containers to provide masses of colour and interest over the summer and into early autumn.

As soon as late spring flowering perennials such, brunnera, aquilegia and dicentra have finished flowering, dead head them to tidy up the plants. In some cases, you may also get a second flush of flowers later in the summer.

Plant outdoor tomatoes in a warm sunny spot, either in the garden or pots of compost. Modern varieties such as 'Mountain Magic' and 'Ferline' have a good resistance to blight which can be a problem later in the summer.

Make sure any newly planted trees, shrubs, fruit bushes or perennials are kept watered during dry weather.

Mow the lawn little and often to help keep it green and lush and don't scalp it as this stresses the lawn and weakens it.

Plant out sweetcorn, courgettes and runner beans after the danger of frost and keep the plants watered to help them establish.

Keep sowing a selection of vegetables directly into the garden such as lettuce, carrots, beetroot, spring onions and peas.
